February Meetings

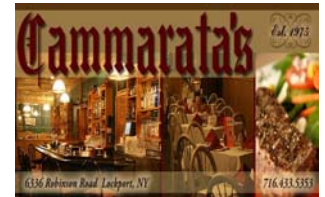

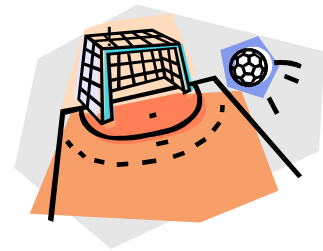


Broom Ball
